1483 Martin Luther, Born at Eisleben, Saxony, Germany, on November 10; baptized the next day, St Martin's Day.

1498 Studied at Eisenach, lived in home of Ursula Cotta.

1501 Entered University of Erfurt for the study of law.

1505 Entered cloister in Erfurt and became an Augustinian Monk.

1507 Ordained as a priest.

1510 Journey to Rome.

1512 Professor of theology at University of Wittenberg. Doctor of Divinity.

1517 October 31, posting of ninety-five theses on door of Castle Church in Wittenberg against abuses of indulgences.

1519 Disputation with Dr. Eck in Leipzig.

1520 Pope threatened to excommunicate Luther. Luther burned the papal bull.

1521 Formally excommunicated from Church of Rome by the Pope. Diet of Worms. "Here I stand." Edict of Worms.

1522 Lived as Junker George (Knight George) at the Wartburg. Translated the New Testament into German. Returned to Wittenberg.

1524 Wrote and published his first twenty-four hymns.

1525 Married Catherine von Bora.

1529 Diet at Speyer. Protestants.

1529 Disputation with Zwingli at Marburg.

1530 Augsburg Confession. Luther at Coburg.

1534 Published translation of the whole Bible.


1537 Smalcald Congress and Articles. Luther's confession.

1545 Beginning of Roman Catholic Council of Trent.

Formulation of Roman Catholic Doctrine.

1546 Died at Eisleben on February 18. Buried in Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany.

Second Lesson: "Sola Fide" By Faith Alone!

⊗ Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. Therefore no one will be

declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law.
