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From the **PASTOR**

The synod's Assignment Committee met a few weeks ago in New Ulm to assign teacher and staff minister candidates graduating from Martin Luther College. A week later they met again, this time in Mequon, Wisconsin to assign pastor candidates to their field of service.

At the assignment in New Ulm, at MLC, all candidates who were able to serve in any location were assigned, with 106 receiving assignment to their first field of service, reassigned to an additional year, or assigned permanently after a temporary assignment. Twelve candidates limited to a specific location (due to marriage or other circumstances) were also assigned to calls in the area in which they will be living. A number of those limited by geography have not yet received their assignment, but the process will continue throughout the summer months, and these candidates will be assigned as requests are received from congregations. Three candidates were also assigned as staff ministers.

Unfortunately, they were not able to fill our request for a candidate to fill the position of Pre- K three and four year old teacher and director of our ECC program here at Samuel. The Board of Education will be working on a way to temporarily fill the need until we can receive a full-time WELS certified teacher for this position.

At Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary In all, 36 men were assigned. Of those, 31 were seniors receiving their first call and five were from the class of 2015 who were reassigned to one-year calls. Four were from the class of 2014 and one was from 2013.

We are thankful to the Lord of the church for supplying these workers for his harvest field, and we are confident that God will use them to carry out his gospel mission. *Junior Confirmation:* The following students were received into communicant membership on May 1, 2016: Lenei Estrada Palmer, Kiah Hoflock, Claire Martinson, Ashely Mauland, Brooke Mauland, Abigail Pullman, Paxton Schultz, Rachel Schwarz, and Sarah Werner

Minutes of Mar 2016 council meeting were read, corrected and approved

Pastors • Report: Pioneers met do make Easter decorations plus other activities. CLYF will meet this coming Sunday Apr 17 to talk about upcoming activities. Long Range (LRPC) update: Planning Committee Discussed church landscaping. The group agreed that church landscaping and tree work is necessary, consensus of the group to use rock instead of mulch. Church Clean Up Day is Monday April 25. We may need to purchase a different lawnmower for the Church properties at 3rd and Marshall. Confirmation will be Sun May 1, examination will be May 24th, 9 students. Christ has started a facebook page, Miss Dorn and her fiancee Jason will oversee it along with Pastor and Jennifer Schreiner. Ascension service and meal Thursday May 5. Hamburgers etc at Pastors backyard, applied for a \$250 Thrivent grant to pay the costs. The cross will be taken down after this service. Pastor is hoping to go back in for knee surgery soon.

• Elders Report: Motion by Elders second by Lyle Patzer :

Kirsten Jurgenson out by release – passed. Motion by Elders, second by Craig Heil Vivian Mix from Zion Tracy In By Transfer – passed. A second round of PWC postcards was sent out. Some follow up has occurred after relocate letters were sent out in Feb 16, no action taken.

• Financial Secretary: Written report was handed out.

• **Treasurer's report:** No major savings activity in March. No major costs in 2016 yet. Total checking and savings stands at \$190k this year vs \$161k py. Mutual fund is at \$135.9k. Mission offerings are currently up \$1700 over last year. Budget offerings are up this year vs last, but Easter was in March in 2015. Net income for 2016 is \$9,474. ECC ytd net income is \$524.

• **Stewardship:** Endowment Sunday will coincide with guest preacher Pastor

• Dietz in Sept 2016 with no special project attached to it. The Endowment committee will determine where/how the funds earnings will be disbursed. Member Tom Gruhot will be archiving church records and documents.

• **Evangelism:** New member pie social will be Sun June 5th, we will participate in the Sounds of Summer and the SMSU Homecoming parades. The group will print a banner with summer hours to be posted in front of church. The committee will promote summer music/VBS to the community.

• Education Report: Motion by Board of Education second by Mark Patzer to "Give a \$.25 per hour raise to the cook effective immediately" – passed. The lower level bathrooms need remodeling, a committee will put together recommendations. A few tile in the kitchen need replacing. Concerning school janitorial duties, the board will look into options from the church membership and will get two bids to have the school cleaned professionally. The slop sink will likely be located in the kitchen, will get a bid to have one installed. Kindergarten round-up was held, 7 children committed. Early Childhood projects 8 three yr old and eleven four year old children. Track meet is May 9th in Sleepy Eye. Softball tourney is Tues May 17th

Activities: Easter breakfast served about 160, cost \$440 donations \$767. Net proceeds go to Summer Music Program/ VBS

Worship: Attendance was good for Holy Week. Summer service times will change again this year same as prior years.

Old Business: Newsletter Council Corner writer next month is Arlen Meyer from Elders (Confirmation topic). Councilmen on Duty for May: Dan and Todd for first service, Arlen and Craig for 2nd service. Two bids to repaint the church interior have been received. \$4200 from Southwest Pro Painters of Marshall and \$7650 from Miesen's Color Center of Springfield. After discussion, motion by Arlen M second by Lyle P to "contract Southwest Pro Painters at a cost of \$4200 + paint from Patzers" motion carried. A "color committee" is looking at different color choices. Funding will come from a variety of sources. We at Christ would like to form a "partnership" between us and WELS Lutheran Childhood Family Services (WLCFS) Member Assistance Program to potentially help members who may need various counseling services that may be beyond the Pastor's abilities. The candidate must go through the Pastor first before being approved for the funds. Motion by Mark P second by Geoff S to "put \$375, or 5 hours x \$75/hour to the membership assistance program with WLFCS for counseling cases that may be beyond a Pastors abilities" - motion passed.

Earlier Childhood Center Update: Round up – 13 children in attendance. Currently have 8 enrolled in the 1^{st} year program of which one might opt to enroll in the 2^{nd} year program. Eleven

currently enrolled in the 2nd year program with 2 possibilities.

Summer program – Mrs. Zander reviewed projected numbers and the variety of schedules. The board reviewed qualifications for a potential internal employee who could serve in the capacity of EC director along with teaching. This would be a potential option if we do not receive a call candidate. Minutes were reviewed from the March 1st meeting and approved with corrections.

<u>Financial – Treasurer Reports:</u> Darik reviewed financial activities for March along with current account balances.

Old Business: Gym floor refinishing will be completed the week of June 20th. Lower level bathrooms remodel was discussed as a potential item to be completed in the near future.
