




From the PASTOR—

Maundy Thursday

2015 budget general offerings final number was \$350,500 which is \$25.5k over budget. \$9,400 from the 3rd street rent was transferred to the Building Improvement Fund to pay towards the \$40k 3rd street renovation project. Actual school tuition in 2015

was \$50,000. Total Offerings and Revenue was up \$21.4k over budget. ECC actual Tuition and Registration was \$125,334 at YE. Early Childhood surplus of \$13,237 was put back into the mutual fund. The School Lighting Retro-fit was paid in full ahead of schedule. Our real estate mortgage stands at \$204,039 at YE. Samuel Lutheran School account balance is \$37,611 at 2015 YE.

Stewardship:

The group will plan an Endowment Sunday in 2016, date TBD.

Evangelism:

Committee will work with the Elders and PWC on a future project.

Education Report:

A school board representative Will meet with the custodian to define expectations. The school board discussed the exploratory committee for ECC director/teacher at it's last meeting. Grandparents day at school is Sat Jan 16. There is also a home BB game that day and a Whopper feed. \$447 from chapel offerings will be given to Urban Ministry. Custodian needs two vacuums, one will come from church that is not used and a new one will be purchased. The gym floor will need refinishing this summer. Basket ball is in full swing. The SLS faculty will be going to New Ulm for a curriculum study on Jan 18th and Feb 15th.
