

## Kindergarten Community Helpers:

POLICE OFFICERS AND OTHERS WHO WORK AT A COURTHOUSE ARE IMPORTANT COMMUNITY **HELPERS:** Mr. Sanow got everything ready so we could go to the Lyon County Courthouse. When we got there, the sheriff met us and talked to us about his job. We thought he mostly gave people tickets for driving too fast but he does lots of other things that help keep us safe. We got to meet a detective, too. He helps solve crimes. Then the sheriff took us to the 9-1-1 center. We got to see their computers and learned what happens when they get a 9-1-1 call. A special siren goes off when a 9-1-1 call comes in. There are special lights that let them know who is calling. When you call from a phone, their computers can tell them where you are, but you still should know your address and phone number. When we left the 9-1-1 center we got to look at special TV monitors that watch the people who are in jail. They are watched all the time. There are men and women in jail. After that we stopped and talked to the lady who takes care of people after there is a disaster like a tornado. Next, we went into the garage and got to look at a sheriff's truck. The deputy showed us some of the tools that are in the truck. The truck has lights, sirens, a computer, and a camera. He showed us his special tool belt, too. He has a gun and a tazer but these are only used if someone is in real danger. He also has a flashlight and handcuffs and a special stick that he can use to break a window if someone needs help. We got to sit in the driver's seat of the truck. While we were talking to the deputy, an attorney came out and we got to talk to him, too. His job is to be sure that the people who have done something wrong are punished. Next, we got to see an armored car that they use if they are going someplace that they know will be really dangerous. After that, another police officer took us to see a courtroom. We had to go through a metal detector before we could get near the courtroom. When we got inside the room, he told us about the different parts of the room. There was a part with white chairs. That is where the people can sit and listen to what is going on. Then there is a separate part where the jury sits. There is also a chair off to the side where the witness sits and answers questions. A witness is a person who has heard or seen something. There are tables where the lawyers sit and there is a big desk at the front where the judge sits. We got to sit in some of these seats. Some of us were jurors, there was a witness, and others were lawyers. When we left the courtroom, we had one more stop to make. We got to see where Mr. Sanow does his work as County Commissioner. There were lots of tables and chairs there, too. They talk about problems people have with streets and roads or with where they live and help solve them. There are A LOT of community helpers working at the courthouse. They all help to keep us safe.

NURSES AND DOCTORS ARE IMPORTANT COMMUNITY HELPERS: Mrs. Wolff came and talked to us

about her job as a nurse and paramedic. She does a lot of work in the Emergency Room. She takes care of people who have been hurt or are very sick. Sometimes people get better and sometimes they don't. When she is working as a paramedic, she gets to go out with the ambulance. She likes being a nurse because she gets to help people. She talks to people to see how they are feeling and she can give them shots or medicine to help them. She tells the doctors what the people have told her. She showed us some of the tools she uses when she is working. One was a fancy scissors that she can use to cut clothes if they need to. Another tool was a very bright light that she uses to check your eyes. The last tool she showed us was her stethoscope. She uses it to listen to your heart but she also uses it to listen to your lungs and even listens to your STOMACH to be sure everything is working the way it should. We got to listen to our hearts, lungs, and stomachs. Everyone sounded healthy<sup>©</sup>. Thank-you, Mrs. Wolff, for helping people stay healthy.
