Fire Prevention Week: This is fire prevention week. The theme is "It's Fire Prevention Week. Protect your Family from Fire!" The Marshall Fire Department will be visiting our school today for fire drills as a part of Operation E.D.I.T.H. On Thursday the third grade students will have an opportunity to experience a smoke filled building in a safe environment when they visit a portable smoke house. Everyone is then invited to an open house and whopper feed at the fire department Thursday evening from 5:30 PM – 8:00 PM.

Firefighter Visits 2nd Year Pre-K: Last Wednesday, Mr. John Wiese of the Russell Fire Department visited our classroom. His daughter Lily is a student in the second year class. He put on all the equipment and clothes that he wears when he is fighting a fire so that we would know what a firefighter looks like when he is working and we would not be afraid if we ever have to be rescued. He told us that if we are in a room that has smoke in it, we should go low and get out as quickly as possible. The microphone on his coat made a loud beeping noise if he stopped moving. It scared us, but he said it was to let others know where he was if he ever got hurt in a fire. We were amazed how much equipment he had to wear. Mr. Wiese has to be strong and fast to be a firefighter. Before he left, he gave all of us a fire helmet, a bracelet, and a coloring booklet. Thanks so much for taking the time to come to our classroom, Mr. Wiese!

Kindergarten Visits Fire Station: As part of Fire Safety Week, the Kindergarten class visited the Marshall Fire Station. We saw a video about Smoke Detectives and learned how to stay safe during a fire. Mr. Carter told us about smoke alarms and fire safety in the home. You have to check smoke alarms to be sure they work and make sure the batteries in them are good. They make a loud noise but it is a sound that will "Protect Your Family from Fire". You also need to practice getting out of your home—Exit Drills In The Home—E.D.I.T.H. Mr. Olson put all of his fire fighter gear on so we could see what a fireman would look like if he came to our home. He may look and sound scary but he is our friend who can help us in a fire. You should never hide from him. Next, we went in the smoke house. It was kind of scary but we knew that we had to "STAY LOW AND GO". We got to see the fire trucks. Some have big ladders to reach tall buildings and some have water tanks to take water to places where they don't have fire hydrants. We got to sit in one of the trucks where the firefighters sit on the way to a fire. We got to practice "STOP, DROP, AND ROLL" and they let us try on a firefighter's coat and hat. We got to have juice and cookies there. Then Pluggy came and talked to us and invited us and our families to the Fire Station this Thursday evening. They gave us bags with fire hats, coloring books, erasers, candy, and lots of other things. We had fun and learned a lot about staying safe if there is a fire.
