Kindergarten Visits Fire Station: As part of Fire Safety Week, the Kindergarten class visited the Marshall Fire Station. We saw a video about Smoke Detectives and learned how to stay safe during a fire. Mr. Fuhrman told us about smoke alarms. You have to check them to be sure they work and make sure the batteries in them are good. They make a loud noise but it is "A Sound You Can Live With"! We got to see the fire trucks including a brand new yellow one that cost a lot of money. We saw a really old red one too. We got to sit in one of the trucks where the firefighters sit on the way to a fire. They showed us where they dry the hoses after they wash them. We got to practice "STOP, DROP, AND ROLL" and they let us try on a firefighter's coat and hat. Mrs. Festerling got to put them on, too. We went in the smoke house. It was kind of scary but we knew that we had to "STAY LOW AND GO". We got to have juice and cookies there. Then Pluggy came and talked to us. They gave us bags with fire hats, coloring books, erasers, candy, and lots of other things. We had fun and learned a lot about staying safe if there is a fire.

Firefighter Jake Olsen Visits Pre-K Second Year Class: On Friday, October 8, Mackenzie Olsen's dad visited the 2nd year Pre-K students to talk to them about fire safety. He brought all of the equipment that he wears when he goes out on a call. He was completely covered so that he would not get burned when he fights a fire. The children really liked trying on the hat and coat. They were both heavy. The hat was so heavy that it pulled your head backwards if you didn't hold your head very still. Mr. Olsen reminded us to get out of your house as fast as possible if you have a fire. If there is smoke, we should "Go Low." Fireman Olsen also brought the big new fire truck that Marshall just got. It was really neat. Everything inside is fastened down so that it can't slide around when they drive to a fire. The fire truck even has two computers inside. Before he left, he gave us each a packet with colors, a coloring book, a badge, and a fire helmet. Mr. Olsen blew the horn as he drove away. The fire truck was the best part of the visit. Thank you for coming to visit us, Mr. Olsen.

Fireman Visits Pre-K First Year Class: Austin and Anna's dad, Mr. Jon Rubendall, visited our class yesterday. He put all of his fire clothes on for us. His boots were in his pants already so that he could get dressed fast. By the time he had all of his equipment on, we couldn't even see any of him. He sounded different with his mask on and he looked a little scary, but we remembered that it was really Austin and Anna's dad under all the clothes. He said that if our house is on fire, we should get out as fast as possible. If we can't get out, we shouldn't hide. We should yell instead so that the firefighters can find you. He also told us to not play with matches or any fire. He told us about Smokey the Bear and gave us a lanyard with Smokey the Bear's face on it. We were really glad that he came to talk to us about fire safety. Thank you for coming.
