Parents,

We have had parents ask about dispensing medicine at school.

Please read the following list:

Tylenol, Maalox, cough syrups, cough drops, vitamins, or any other over-the-counter (OTC) medications.

The nurse recommends that parents give these types of things at home before school, after school, and at bedtime if necessary so the school does not need to become involved.

The nurse also suggests mints or lemon drops work as well as the medicated cough drops. Since these are not medicine, teachers could supervise use of these items.

If specific circumstances occur where your child needs to take prescribed medicine at times away from home, you would have to contact the school nurse. Our nurse, Mrs. Flock, is not in the school every day. She comes in once a week to do paper work and give advice if we have any health questions.
