Kindergarten Visit to Holmberg Orchard: The Kindergarten class took a trip to Holmberg Orchard on Friday, September $17^{\text {th }}$. We couldn't go on a hayride because it was too wet and muddy and the tractor would get stuck. We walked on a rocky path between the trees. The lady told us there are more than 7,000 apple trees at the orchard and lots of different kinds of apples. We each got to pick an apple to take home. We saw pretend owls and boxes on tall poles. The boxes make LOUD noises. They help to keep the birds away so they won't eat the apples. They have a tall electric fence that keeps the deer away from the apples, too. After we looked at the trees, we went in a big, cold room. There were lots of apples in there. Some were in bags and some were in boxes. They keep caramel in there too so they can make caramel apples. Then we went into the next room and saw them washing the apples. They wash them 2 times-first in a big tub and then the apples get a shower and get scrubbed. Next we saw the machine that sorts the apples by size. Then the people put them in bags. We got to play in a boat filled with corn and we got coloring books about apples. We had apples for snacks and Mrs. Festerling bought caramel apples for us to taste. YUM! We had fun at the orchard.
