Tuesday, April 4th – 1 John 1:7b “the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.”

Thursday, April 6th – The Fifth Commandment “You shall not murder.”

Friday, April 7th – 391:1 “God loved the world so that he gave his only Son the lost to save that all who would in him believe should everlasting life receive.”
