

Saved by Grace

When the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. - Titus 3:4-5

What can happen if you forgot to close the gate in your back yard and you let the dog out? You were 99% sure you closed it. What might happen if you are 99% sure you turned the stove off before you left the house? We don't like to be less than 100% sure of something; it makes us uncomfortable that something bad can happen.

That's why we really like the word GRACE. For the past 500 years the Lutheran church has focused on the fact that the Bible tells us very plainly that we are saved by grace. God tells us that he has done everything for our salvation and he gives eternal life to us as a free gift—there is nothing we have to do for it. This is an amazing message of good news!

However, the proclamation of God's Word wasn't always clear. For many years the message of the Bible was not made available to everyone. People went to church, they confessed their sins, they heard the priest tell them to go and do certain things and then maybe, hopefully they might make it into heaven. How would people ever know if they did enough, or if they were good enough? They were led to believe that Jesus' life and death were not enough; they still had to contribute in some way for their salvation. Even after they died, someone still might need to do something to help them finally reach heaven. Imagine the doubt.

The Word of God removes all doubt about our salvation. The Bible teaches us: "When the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy." Salvation does not depend on what we do, but entirely on what Jesus Christ came to do for us.

Jesus had great mercy on us. In his love he died the death we deserved and rescued us from our sins. By faith in him as our Savior, we have complete confidence of eternal life in heaven.

This is the main message of the Bible that we preach and teach in the Lutheran church. We are saved by grace through Jesus. Please come and hear it for yourself. We have a wonderful opportunity to gather this year again for Holy Week celebrations at God's house. There we will once again hear with 100% certainty that our sins have been washed away in the blood of the Lamb and that the empty tomb means we too shall rise and live with our Lord and Savior in heaven. Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. Jason Kotecki was present to discuss the new Facebook page that has been created for the school and EC program. He also presented potential marketing ideas for the EC program by running targeted ads on Facebook. It is a fairly low cost option considering the potential number of people that can be reached. Members can also share and promo the school as well to additionally help spread the word. Motion by Darik to spend up to \$75 to run ads on Facebook beginning approximately 3 weeks prior to Pre-K round up. Target will be a 30 mile radius of Marshall. Seconded by Nick. No further discussion. Motion passed. At the end of the discussion Jason excused himself from the meeting.

Additional EC Marketing discussion items:

- •To reduce confusion and to better connect the school with the church do we need to consider a name change? Just something to think about.
- •Clarification on tuition for 4 or more kids as the tuition list has rates up to 4 children. The consensus is additional children would be charged the same tuition as the 4th child. Mr. Festerling will revise the wording.
- •The EC and before/after school rate discount for non-called workers was discussed. No action taken at this time.

Radio advertising option was presented by Pastor as put together by Marshall Radio. The 30 second ads would run a few weeks prior and after pre-K and Kindergarten rounds up. Motion by Dave to spend up to \$700 on radio ads through Marshall Radio using the marketing plan and airing schedule as suggested by Marshall Radio. Seconded by Nick. No further discussion. Motion passed.

Minutes: Minutes were reviewed and approved with corrections from the January 3 meeting.

<u>Financial</u> – <u>Treasurer Reports:</u> Darik reviewed financial activities for January along with current account balances. We currently have 1 family with an outstanding balance however they are actively working to get caught up.

Old Business: Aide for Mrs. Kotecki – Mrs. Werner is on board and the additional help is already making a difference. EC Call – the call that was sent on 2/5 has been acknowledged. Round ups – Kindergarten March 6 and Pre-K March 13. Mrs. Zander and possibly Mrs. Berg will be on hand for the Pre-K round up. No changes will be made to the current EC contract or rate per hour. Lunch Report: It would be beneficial to add a garbage disposal to the main sink in the kitchen. This will be brought forward to the maintenance committee. Also since we purchase our milk from Variety Foods, they might be willing to supply a milk cooler as our current one is getting up there in age.

Pastor/Teacher Reports: CLYF – BWCA deposit from members due by 2/19. The March meeting will be held with area churches. Pioneers – next meeting is February 12 with the group continuing work on their pine cars. PTF backboards - it has been decided there is not a good place to install them so they will be returned. Mrs. Zander's retirement celebration - will be held May 21 with PTF hosting. Mrs. MacArthur - will be attending continuing education classes. Coaches' hotel - Motion by Craig to pay \$100 for the head coach and \$75 for assistant coach to help defray some of the cost for their hotel rooms and also a small token of thanks for all their time. Seconded by Darik. No further discussion. Motion passed. Sewer fix – sewer line was plugged further out from the school. A plumber was called in but they were unable to resolve the issue. The city was called in and found and corrected the issue. Possible cause is either baby wipes or Clorox type of wipes that formed a ball. Music - since we do not have a band this year we are offering the opportunity for kids to participate in a one day band festival at MLC called Jr Knights. Cost is \$5 per child which will be covered by the school for anyone interested. Long Range Planning Committee committee recently meet. Highlighted items discussed regarding the school: security doors with a potential option now available through Living Connected and flooring replacement (carpeting and/or tile).

From the Board: Bullying – staff continues to highlight the subject. Replacement basketballs are needed. Will check with Borch's.

Next meeting –March 7 at 7:00 pm Pastor closed the meeting with the Benediction.
