From the **PASTOR**—

Every year, we retrace the whole life of Christ through the church year. We celebrate Christ's birth at Christmas. And we celebrate his death and resurrection at Good Friday and Easter. In the weeks that come in-between, we hear about the words and works of Jesus-his early life, ministry, miracles, teaching, and so on. But we cover all of that-about 33 years of real life events—in just a couple months! We walk through the whole life of Jesus each year, but we do it in fast forward!

That is, until Palm Sunday. Every year, beginning on Palm Sunday, we hit pause for a moment, come out of "fast forward mode," and walk in real time for a bit. Every year we follow Jesus from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem to the cross and then to his empty tomb going day by day. The day our Lord entered Jerusalem on a donkey was a Sunday. And the night on which Jesus celebrated with his disciples was a Thursday. He died on a Friday and rose triumphant over death the following Sunday.

We even observe the very hours, when we know them. The hours on which our Lord hung on the cross are the hours from about noon to three in the afternoon. Later that night the followers of Jesus-his closest friends and disciples-were in mourning trying to hurriedly give their friend a proper burial. So, on Good Friday we gather in the afternoon to retrace those final moments before Jesus declares his work of atonement to be finished. Then that evening we gather again to meditate on the great sacrifice our Lord made in dying the death and suffering the punishment that we deserve.

And early in the morning on the first day of the week, women went to the tomb to finish the burial ceremonies for which there didn't have time earlier. But he was no longer there. He had risen!

After Easter, we continue this real-time celebration. The Gospel on the Sunday after Easter took place on the Sunday after Easter. We celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven forty days after Easter, on the Thursday which falls forty days after Easter. And Pentecost (which means fifty), takes place exactly fifty days after Easter.

The reason we do this is in part to remind ourselves that the events of these days actually happened, in real time. These are not myths and legends. Just as Jesus was born when Quirinius was governor of Syria, Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension took place during real days with real time in real history.

But we retrace these days each year, not just to merely commemorate historical events. We are not play-acting and reenacting these events. Because we have been baptized into Christ, we have been baptized into his death and resurrection (Ro. 6). That means that by virtue of our baptism, his death and resurrection are ours. What we are repeating is what has happened to us! The death, burial, resurrection, and ascension that we are really observing are our own!

It is no wonder, then, that Christians have not been satisfied to repeat this only once a year. But every Lord's Day, every Sunday is also a repetition of this greatest event in our lives. Every Sunday is a little Easter, and so we too get up early in the morning on the first day of the week. We go to find—not the body of a dead Jesus—but to find that the grave is empty. We come each Sunday to see that Jesus' tomb stands empty as a guarantee that death has been conquered and the promise of eternal life belongs to you and me!

HOLY WEEK

Maundy Thursday

We hope and pray that you will spend Holy week worshipping your merciful Savior starting with Maundy Thursday on April 14. The Lord's Supper will be celebrated at this service which begins at 7:00 PM. The word MAUNDY comes from the Latin word Mandate which means command. The command was not to receive the Lord's Supper, as some think, since Jesus instituted it on this day. No, the command he gave was that we love one another. Jesus, of course, showed us the full extent of his love for us by going to the cross. At this service we also remember the blessed meal which he gave us whereby we receive his body and blood - in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.

Good Friday

At Christ we offer two different services on Good Friday, April 15. The first service will start at 1:00 PM and will feature special choral music by our school children. The second service will be held at 7:00 PM. This will be a Tenebrae service of darkness which will stand as a moving reminder of the darkness of our sins and what they caused.

Easter Sunday Celebration

Please make plans to attend the highest festival in the church year - Easter on April 17. Two services will be offered at 7:00 and 10:30 AM. These services WILL BE the same.

Easter Breakfast

Please join us between our two Easter services for our Easter breakfast, prepared by our church council. It is held at Samuel and runs from about <u>8:00-9:15</u> AM. The menu will include scrambled eggs, egg bake, sausage, French toast sticks, donuts, juice and coffee.
