

Verse of the Day





VERSE OF THE DAY: The Word of God...sharper than any two-edged sword discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

SERVICE NOTES:

- First Lesson: When God makes right what has gone wrong, He will receive the praise of His people.
- Second Lesson: The law reveals sin which leads to death. The glory of the gospel outshines even the glowing face of Moses.
- Gospel: Jesus' word and actions alone are able to undo the effects of sin.
- My Soul, Now Bless Your Maker: This hymn was written at the request of Elector Margrave Albrecht of Brandenburg-Ansbach, duke of Prussia. It was based on Psalm 103, his favorite psalm. Written in 1525, it is one of the oldest Lutheran hymns.
- Words of Institution: "The Son of God commended to his church the Words of Institution of the Supper in the form of a last will and testament—at a time of high emotion, with most fervent prayer, and under the most serious circumstances on the night in which he was betrayed. Therefore these words should be observed with the greatest reverence and piety and in the fear of the Lord by all people, for they are the words of the testament of the Son of God." — Martin Chemnitz

- Draw Near and Take the Body of the Lord: According to Irish legend, St. Patrick and his nephew Sechnall had an argument, with Sechnall accusing Patrick of preaching charity too little and Patrick threatening to ride his chariot over Sechnall. When the two men came together and were finally reconciled in the church cemetery, they heard angels inside singing this hymn (#309). They obeyed the command to "Draw Near" and entered the church to partake of the sacrament. The legend concludes, "Wherefore from that time forth, this hymn is sung in Ireland when they go to Christ's body."
- Oh, for a Thousand Tongues to Sing: "Had I a thousand tongues, I would praise Him with them all." Peter Böhler, a Moravian missionary who had a great influence on John Wesley, this hymn's author.
