All "bad" joking aside, we still find ourselves consumed in the continuing Covid controversial conversation. And yes, it is controversial. That also might not come as news to you! I am convinced, that when this is all over, we will be a church, and membership, that is stronger than a virus. We will be a church, and membership, that can take on other challenges that God gives us, and handle them in love. Notice, I did not say that we will always handle them correctly or in total agreement with each other but we will handle them in love. That is my prayer for all of us at Christ.
