## *From the* **PASTOR**—

### *Confession of Faith*

**If you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. - Romans 10:9**

Did you ever wonder what made the early Christians willing to confess their faith in Jesus even when it brought persecution and death? Some Christians in the first century were stoned to death. Others were crucified. Still others were thrown to the lions. Yet they died praising Jesus, confessing him as their Lord and Savior.

In the centuries that followed, believers in Jesus continued preaching and teaching about him even at the threat of physical harm. One such man was Martin Luther who lived in Germany back in the 1500's. Luther boldly preached and taught about Jesus and became one of the most prolific writers about the Christian faith who has ever lived. When the authorities pressured him to take back what he had written, Luther firmly replied, “Here I stand. I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Amen!” As a result, he was labeled an outlaw and it was open season for anyone who wanted to take his life.

How could Luther and many other Christians confess their faith so boldly even at the threat of physical harm and death? Because they knew that something much better was waiting for them after this life. They knew that Jesus died for their sins and rose from the dead. Jesus' resurrection meant that God accepted his sacrifice for their sins and they too would rise to live forever in heaven.

Christians still have this hope today. We know this life is temporary. Nothing in this life is going to last. It will all eventually decay and perish. But those who trust in Jesus and confess him as their Lord and Savior will enjoy a perfect life with him that will never end. This changes the perspective and priorities of believers in Jesus. Confident in their eternal salvation through Jesus, Christians confess their faith in the Lord Jesus even to the point of death.

During this very busy month of the year we have many opportunities to come to God's house to worship him and learn more about what confessing Christians throughout the ages have been willing to die for. Jesus is your Savior who was born into this world to die and rise again so that you might live with him forever.

## **COUNCIL CORNER**

The Advent season offers great opportunities for Evangelism. In December there are a few events going on to help spread the message of our Savior's birth. On Wednesday, December 6th the Evangelism committee will be hosting a spaghetti supper before the first Advent service. Proceeds from this meal will go towards our summer music program. On Wednesday, December 13th and 20th, the Samuel School PTF will be hosting suppers before the Advent services, a free will offering will be taken these evenings which any proceeds will go to the schools PTF group. The PTF supports the school with purchases of needed equipment and also helps plan activities for the kids throughout the year.

December 9th we will be holding our annual Christmas for Kids, a one day vacation Bible school, at Samuel School. It will take place from 11:00-1:30, after the children's Christmas service rehearsal. It will be an afternoon of faith and fellowship with music, lunch, crafts and, most importantly, the Christmas story. More information on this can be found later in this newsletter.

## ADVENT SEASON

The Advent Wreath, which originated after the Reformation, is probably the most common used fixture for the season. Four Advent candles are used in an Advent wreath to mark the four weeks before Christmas. One additional candle is lit each week of the Advent season. The lighting of the candles symbolizes the coming of Christ, when the light of prophecy concerning the Messiah became brighter and brighter until he himself appeared. Originally four white candles were used, but now most churches, including ours, use either blue or purple to match the paraments. One pink, or rose-colored, candle is used and lighted the third Sunday in Advent. Our Advent wreath also has a single white candle in the middle of the wreath called the Christ candle. We pray that this wreath and all other church signs and symbols help focus our attention on the object of our worship – Jesus Christ, God's Son our Savior.



Our midweek Advent services will be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM. The dates are December 6, 13, and 20. We hope you will take time and let God prepare your hearts to receive the Christ child during this most blessed season. This year there will be a meal served in the church basement before each of these services. The meal will run from 5:30 – 6:30.

Then a reminder of all the Christmas services taking place at your church. We start with the children's service on Christmas Eve held out to Samuel starting at 5:30 PM. A favorite of many is the traditional Christmas Eve Candlelight service held at church at **9:00 PM**. There is something special about holding a candle (symbolizing the Christ child as the light of the world) and singing "*Silent Night*" with the lights of the church dimmed. If you have not experienced this before you might want to consider doing so.

## PUBLIC SCHOOL CONFIRMATION CLASS

Parents please remember that during the season of Advent, when we have midweek services, our Public School Confirmation Class is held from 5:00-6:15 PM on Wednesday evening AT CHURCH. I know that it is not always easy getting your child there at that time but please remember how important this class is for their spiritual growth.

## PIONEERS

The Pioneer youth group met on November 12<sup>th</sup> at Samuel Lutheran School. A total of fourteen Pioneers were in attendance. We began the meeting by collecting ideas from the group on why we are thankful. A slide show of hurricanes, earthquakes, and diseases that are more common in other parts of the world was presented and discussed. While we are thankful that we have not had our homes or belongings destroyed in a natural disaster, we are most thankful that we know about the love our Savior has for us. He loved us so much that he died on the cross to take our sins away, and we need to do our part to share this good news with all people. Each Pioneer then drew a turkey, colored it, and named it by mixing up the letters in his or her first name. (As examples, Randi's turkey was named "Andri", and Alex named his turkey "Axel".) An apple dessert was enjoyed by all. The Pioneers will meet again in January 2018.
