PIONEERS

The Pioneers celebrated an "attitude of gratitude". We talked about Jesus and the 10 lepers and how we need to thank God for all things – good and bad. The kids made thank you notes for someone (their choice). Some chose teachers, parents, coaches. Then we talked about all the things we are thankful for and that many people in Marshall aren't as fortunate as many of us. I had received some information from the ladies at the Food Shelf and shared that with the kids. They were all surprised to hear that the food shelf has served 25 families consistently and 1400 kids so far this year. Based on a recommendation from the food shelf, we put together 30 hygiene kits that we donated.

CLYF

As a group we are happy that we are able to offer the Christmas greenery to the members of Christ. This year we had orders for 94 items! The cross wreaths that hang outside of church at both entrances were also purchased by our group. We will not be meeting in December but want to wish all a blessed Christmas.

Just a reminder that you can also show your support for our high school aged youth by praying for them. The teenaged years can be tough and what could be better than asking God to bless these future leaders of our church and synod! Another way you can help is by purchasing the Hy-Vee gift cards. You get face dollar amount and we make 5% on the dollar. It is a GREAT deal. If you don't presently use these cards please consider doing so. Look for Jennifer Schreiner or Linda Onken, and their blue folders, before and after services and they can tell you more.

BUDGET/ELECTION MEETING

This budget/election meeting will be held on Sunday, December 1st at 7:00 PM at church.

ADVENT SEASON

The Advent Wreath, which originated after the Reformation, is probably the most common used fixture for the season. Four Advent candles are used in an Advent wreath to mark the four weeks before Christmas. One additional candle is lit each week of the Advent season. The lighting of the candles symbolizes the coming of Christ, when the light of prophecy concerning the Messiah became brighter and brighter until he himself appeared.

Originally four white candles were used, but now most churches, including ours, use either blue or purple to match the paraments. One pink, or rose-colored, candle is used and lighted the third Sunday in Advent. Our Advent wreath also has a single white candle in the middle of the wreath called the Christ candle. We pray that this wreath and all other church signs and symbols help focus our attention on the object



of our worship – Jesus Christ, God's Son our Savior.

Our midweek Advent services will be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM. The dates are December 4, 11, and 18. We hope you will take time and let God prepare your hearts to receive the Christ child during this most blessed season. This year there will be a meal served in the church basement before each of these services. The meal will run from 5:30 - 6:30.

Then a reminder of all the Christmas services taking place at your church. We start with the children's service on Christmas Eve held out to Samuel starting at 5:30 PM. A favorite of many is the traditional Christmas Eve Candlelight service held at church at **9:00 PM**. There is something special about holding a candle (symbolizing the Christ child as the light of the world) and singing *"Silent Night"* with the lights of the church dimmed. If you have not experienced this before you might want to consider doing so.

ADVENT DEVOTIONS

I pray that you were in church the last couple weeks of November and received your Advent Devotional booklet produced by MLC. If so a reminder that they start December 1st. Those 25 daily devotions will help prepare our hearts to receive the Christ child this Christmas. Take a couple minutes out of your day as an individual, couple or family, spending time in God's Word. If you did not get a copy ask Pastor if there are any left.

PUBLIC SCHOOL CONFIRMATION CLASS

Parents please remember that during the season of Advent, when we have midweek services, our Public School Confirmation Class is held from 5:00-6:15 PM on Wednesday evening AT CHURCH. I know that it is not always easy getting your child there at that time but please remember how important this class is for their spiritual growth.

LIGHT UP THE NIGHT

I hope you already have Saturday, December 7 on your calendar to come to Independence Park to be a part of Christ Lutheran's night to help with the Prairie Home Hospice event. If you are not one of the volunteers who signed up to help then why not come



out and enjoy the festivities? All the proceeds of that night will go directly to Hospice. This is a IRIE OME great way for us to give back to the community HOSPICE & we all love and call home. Hope to see you on the 7th between 5-9 PM.
