From the **PASTOR**

Come, Jesus, Come

You might know that Johann Sebastian Bach, the celebrated 18th century composer, was a devout Lutheran. Perhaps his most significant works are his church cantatas, which were written for the Sundays of the church year. Every Sunday for many years Bach constructed a collection of music (about twenty minutes long) based on the readings for the Sunday. When Bach was the court musician in Weimar, Germany in 1714, he wrote a cantata for the First Sunday in Advent based on the hymn "Savior of the Nations, Come" (CW #2). This is probably why this is still the Hymn of the Day for Advent 1. The readings which were read at Christ Lutheran last Sunday were the same that Bach heard that Sunday over 300 years ago!

The text of a cantata is made up of hymn texts, Scripture passages, and other poetry called the *libretto*. For this cantata, the librettist was Erdmann Neumeister (author of the hymns "Jesus, Sinners Does Receive" and "God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It").

At the beginning of a new church year, the Christian Church renews its prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus." Since Jesus has not yet returned to us to bring us home, we prepare ourselves to hear again the story of the life of Christ—His birth, ministry, suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension—in another year of our Lord (A.D.). And in this way, our Lord Jesus, even if He does not come in glory this year, does in fact come to us. Jesus comes to us by His Spirit. He comes to us by His Word that is preached to us. He comes to us by His Sacrament which is distributed from the altar. And He has promised that He will continue doing so until He finally comes again. This cantata for the First Sunday in Advent includes this beautiful tenor aria:

Come, Jesus, come to your Church and grant us a blessed new year! Increase the honor of your name, Preserve sound teaching and bless pulpit and altar!

In this new church year, when your congregation is beginning a vacancy in her pulpit and at her altar, may this be our prayer. It will be mine, as I seek to serve you in the vacancy. I also join you in praying that your pulpit and chancel is soon filled with another permanent shepherd sent to you by the Good Shepherd.

ADVENT SEASON



The Advent Wreath, which originated after the Reformation, is probably the most common used fixture for the season. Four Advent candles are used in an Advent wreath to mark the four weeks before Christmas. One additional candle is lit each week of the Advent season. The lighting of the candles symbolizes the coming of Christ, when the light of prophecy concerning the Messiah became brighter and

brighter until he himself appeared. Originally four white candles were used, but now most churches, including ours, use either blue or purple to match the paraments. One pink, or rose-colored, candle is used and lighted the third Sunday in Advent. Our Advent wreath also has a single white candle in the middle of the wreath called the Christ candle. We pray that this wreath and all other church signs and symbols help focus our attention on the object of our worship – Jesus Christ, God's Son our Savior.

We will have two midweek Advent services on December 9 and 23 at 7:00 PM. You will need to register on our website if you plan to attend. We will be singing at these services. We hope you will take time and let God prepare your hearts to receive the Christ child during this most blessed season.
