Verse of the Day

The congregation sings this alleluia <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> the proper verse is sung by the minister or soloist.



The Christian liturgy is made up of ordinaries and propers. The <u>ordinaries</u> are the parts that stay the same from week to <u>week</u>. These are "ordinarily" the *Kyrie*, *Gloria in excelsis*, *Credo* (Creed), *Sanctus*, and the *Agnus Dei*. The <u>propers</u> are the parts that change each week and are proper to that particular Sunday. Propers include the appointed readings, prayers, psalms, verses, and hymns. The Verse of the Day is a proper. Sometimes, in absence of the proper verse, a general verse may be sung.

SERVICE NOTES:

- All Christians Who Have Been Baptized: Paul Gerhardt first published this hymn in 1667 during a period when he was without a pastorate and removed from his post for confessional adherence to the Formula of Concord. Lutheran pastor and translator Jon Vieker first came across this Gerhardt hymn in 1989 while investigating the doctrine of Baptism as confessed in the first German hymnal of the LCMS (1847). Unfortunately, Gerhardt's hymn never made it into any Englishlanguage hymnals in America. When Vieker began assisting in the work of developing the Lutheran Service Book hymnal (2006), he submitted his translation of Gerhardt's hymn, originally in 12 stanzas.
- All Mankind Fell in Adam's Fall: This hymn's author, Lazarus Spengler, was included in the papal bull which excommunicated Martin Luther in 1520. He was responsible for helping to open one of

- the first Lutheran schools, and in 1530 signed the Augsburg Confession. He was a layman.
- The opening words of the Preface are among the oldest sentences in the Christian liturgy. The responses are followed by the Proper Preface, which are specific to the "proper" season of the church year. The entire liturgy is composed of ordinary elements, which remain the same from week to week, and propers, which change from week to week or season to season.
- The notation for chanting the words of our Lord instituting the Lord's Supper was composed by Martin Luther and published in his Deutsche Messe (LW 53, p. 80).
- The Ten Commandments Are the Law: This is the hymn Martin Luther wrote to help teach the Ten Commandments to children. In each stanza, the commandment is given in the first line and the subsequent lines give further explanation.
