

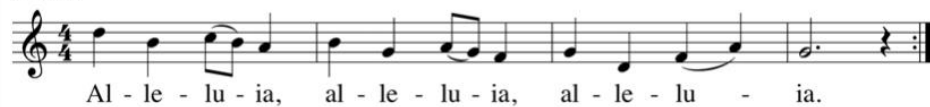

### Verse of the Day

The Christian liturgy is made up of ordinaries and propers. The ordinaries are the parts that stay the same from week to week. These are “ordinarily” the *Kyrie*, *Gloria in excelsis*, *Credo* (Creed), *Sanctus*, and the *Agnus Dei*. The propers are the parts that change each week and are proper to that particular Sunday. Propers include the appointed readings, prayers, psalms, verses, and hymns. The Verse of the Day is a proper. Sometimes, in absence of the proper verse, a general verse may be sung.

### SERVICE NOTES:

- First Lesson: The prophet Elijah thought that his work had been for nothing, but at the voice of Lord he goes forth with confidence.
- Second Lesson: The message of Christ crucified may seem to be a foolish message, but it is the powerful and wise voice of God.
- Gospel: Letting down the nets in the middle of the day seemed to be foolish, but at Jesus’ word Peter obeyed. Even those who catch men “fish” according to Jesus’ Word and let Him bring success.
- Come, Follow Me, the Savior Spoke: Johann Scheffler’s father fled his native Poland because he refused to denounce Lutheranism.
- Christ, Who Called the Twelve: “The church, as a praying community, is in many respects characterized by the two obscure disciples who unknowingly walked with the Risen Lord toward the village of Emmaus. Like them, we are a ‘pilgrim people’—always en route to the

table where Christ makes himself known, and beyond that, to the ‘Lamb’s High Feast’—transcending time and space. During the journey, we are often oblivious of the identity of the One who walks beside us.... But light breaks upon us from the One who opens the Scriptures to us and discloses himself in the breaking of bread. In the meantime, while we’re on the way, hymns are among the best companions we could hope to have.” –Herman Stuempfle
