From the **PASTOR**—

God's Encouraging Word ... when I am overwhelmed

Minutes: Minutes were reviewed and approved.

<u>Financial – Treasurer Reports:</u> Darik reviewed financial activity for the month of February along with the current balances. Mr. Festerling stated that he had a conversation with Mrs. Onken and student account balances are looking good. Darik confirmed last year's amount that was given to basketball coaches for the New Ulm Basketball tournament. The amounts were \$100 for head coach and \$75 for assistant coach. <u>Lunch Report:</u> Freezers: the repair man came in to look at the freezers and flush them out. Convection oven bids came in: Maxwell Foods; \$4,617, Reinhardt; \$3,728, Variety Foods; \$2,912. A motion made being we have a good match and it is compatible; we go with the bid from Variety Foods. Motion made by Craig and 2nd by Darik.

<u>Pastor/Teacher Reports:</u> The 8th grade class would like to do something as a Memorial for Rebekah Swanson who would have been graduating this year. They talked about it and are thinking of planting a tree in her memory. Bid came in for new gym wall mats under the basketball hoops. Gopher Sports: \$1,251 for mats. If we want to add graphics, it is an additional \$1,051. It was decided that graphics were not needed. Quote to redo the gym floor came in at \$2,208. Motion made Darik and 2nd by Nick to move forward with getting gym floors done. A review of the calendar will be done to determine a good time to do this.

Computer repair: the hard drive went out on one of the classroom yoga machines. The cost to repair it was \$134.99 and Mr. Festerling has done this already and has to present the invoice still. MAP Testing, online testing-spring testing was a lot smoother than the fall testing.

From the Board: The 2018-2019 school year calendar was presented. Mr. Festerling said the band teacher has decided to not return next year to teach band. Mike stated that basketballs have been purchased. Mike asked if the school is included in the Share Your Time and Skills Event. Making up snow days were discussed and the board made the decision to not make up the 3 snow days. We are not held at the same requirements as the public schools are with amount of required days.
