From the PASTOR—

On Lutherans and Confirmation

Did you know that Lutherans did not always practice confirmation? Because confirmation was not commanded in Scripture and there was no divine promise attached to it, Lutherans could not agree with the idea that confirmation was a sacrament as it was taught and practiced in the church of Rome. For this reason, Martin Luther and others maintained that confirmation itself was unnecessary and useless.

Later Lutherans, such as Martin Chemnitz ("the second Martin") concluded that confirmation could actually be useful and edifying for the church, explaining that even though the rite and ceremony was not commanded by Scripture, it was a useful practice because it could be associated with Christian catechesis (teaching), public profession of the faith, and prayer for the catechumens. These same elements are still the chief part of our practice of confirmation. A couple differences are that they did not have a set age for confirmation, and it wasn't always combined with a child's first communion. Children were confirmed when they had been sufficiently instructed, and they usually began communing at an earlier age than our typical custom today (typically 7–10 years of age). In those cases, confirmation was a separate rite that took place at a later time.

On Sunday, May 2, six young people from Christ Lutheran received the Rite of Confirmation. Because most of our adult members became communicant members though the practice of Confirmation, it makes this a good time of year for everyone to review the instruction they received once upon a time and the promises they made on their confirmation day.

When you hear these questions asked of our confirmands, answer them for yourself anew. Here is an example of some of those questions:

Do you believe that the teaching of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, is faithful and true to the Word of God?

Do you intend to continue steadfast in this teaching and to endure all things, even death, rather than fall away from it?

Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the teachings of God's Word, to be faithful in the use of the Word and sacrament, and in faith and action remain true to God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as long as you live?

Notice that the answer to these questions is not only given on a spring day in front of church. They are answers that you live out the rest of your life. It's worth asking: Do you still believe this? Do you know what the Catechism says? Are these still your intentions today?

And of course, the strength to continue answering "I do" is found in the strength God gives through the teaching of the Word of God, the Catechism, and in the use of Word and Sacrament. I encourage all of us, young and old, to regularly review the Small Catechism, (re)commit it to memory, and continue to grow in the faith which you received in Holy Baptism and confessed publicly at your confirmation.

On Tuesday, June 1, Christ Lutheran will host the Minnesota River Valley Delegate Conference. This meeting is for pastor, teacher, and congregational delegates to preview the reports and proposals in preparation for this summer's Synod Convention. This year's convention will be held at Luther Preparatory School in Watertown, WI. Only select delegates will attend the convention in person, and other business such as floor committee work and elections will be conducted electronically in advance. Pastor Caauwe is a delegate to the convention, but will not have to attend in person.

Stewardship/Endowment: Discussed PPP loan at committee meeting. Motion by Geoff Stelter for council recommendation to Voters to apply for EANS funds for technology updates at the school. Second by Dave Biastock, passed. Motion by Brian Onken for council recommendation to voters to apply for forgiveness of PPP loan funds. Second by Lennis Kennedy, passed.

Education: Call meeting for Pre-K teacher held April 12. RoundUps-4 in attendance 5 possibly attending next year for Kindergarten, 15 signed up for Pre-k next year. Activities Banquet April 25. Graduation June 3. Lights have been replaced in gym. Bathrooms by gym-consensus from council for Board of Education to gather detailed estimate of repairs/remodel work to be presented at voters meeting.
