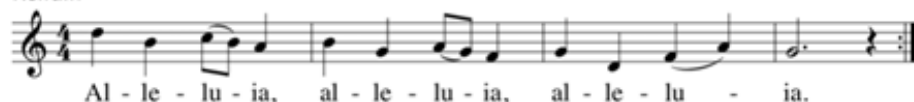
SERVICE NOTES:

- The Prayer of the Day (or Collect) is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Most of these prayers have been in continuous use in the Church for more than 1,500 years. In praying the Collect, we join with the great body of believers, the communion of saints, and with the generations yet to come.
The congregation makes the Collect its own with its "amen," declaration that what has been said is true and affirming its trust in the Lord's Gospel promise; "yes, yes, this is most certainly true."
- Go, My Children, with My Blessing: This hymn was written on July 26, 1983 by Lutheran pastor Jaroslav Vajda. It places the words of the blessing into the mouth of the Triune God, who is dismissing the congregation after worship while reviewing the events that have transpired during the service.

Verse of the Day

The congregation sings this alleluia before and after the proper verse is sung by the minister or soloist.

The Christian liturgy is made up of ordinaries and propers. The ordinaries are the parts that stay the same from week to week. These are "ordinarily" the *Kyrie*, *Gloria in excelsis*, *Credo* (Creed), *Sanctus*, and the *Agnus Dei*. The propers are the parts that change each week and are proper to that particular Sunday. Propers include the appointed readings, prayers, psalms, verses, and hymns. The Verse of the Day is a proper. Sometimes, in absence of the proper verse, a general verse may be sung.
