SERVICE NOTES:

- Oh, Love, How Deep: The tune DEO GRACIAS was the melody used for a song celebrating the victory of King Henry V of England at the battle of Agincourt in October of 1415. The hymn text originates from the same time period.
- O God, My Faithful God: Like a few other hymns here and there in history, this one was invoked to assist in battle: "At Leuthen, in Silesia, Dec. 5, 1757, the Prussians under Frederick the Great stood face to face with an Austrian army thrice their number. Just as they were about to engage, some of the soldiers began to sing st. 2, and the regimental bands joined in." The Prussians were victorious in this battle.
- Medieval monks are credited with the custom of ringing a bell three times during the Lord's Prayer. The idea was to alert people in the area surrounding the monastery or church that the Lord's Prayer was being spoken in those buildings and they could join in from a distance. The bell peal at the beginning, middle, and end of the Lord's Prayer helped those distant pray-ers keep pace with those who were praying the prayer inside the buildings.

Verse of the Day

The congregation sings this alleluia <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> the proper verse is sung by the minister or soloist.



The Christian liturgy is made up of ordinaries and propers. The <u>ordinaries</u> are the parts that stay the same from week to <u>week</u>. These are "ordinarily" the *Kyrie*, *Gloria in excelsis*, *Credo* (Creed), *Sanctus*, and the *Agnus Dei*. The <u>propers</u> are the parts that change each week and are proper to that particular Sunday. Propers include the appointed readings, prayers, psalms, verses, and hymns. The Verse of the Day is a proper. Sometimes, in absence of the proper verse, a general verse may be sung.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION: Please note that the communion assistant will speak words of distribution ("The blood of Christ, shed for you") when communicants take an individual cup from the tray. You may drink right after you have received it. The pastor will bring the chalice to those who wish to drink from it. You are asked to hold your empty cup visibly so that the pastor can see who has already received the blood of our Lord.
