From the **PASTOR**

God's Encouraging Word ... when I am burdened with guilt

Over the years I have had to deal with a number of people who are overwhelmed by their guilt. Sometimes they have taken more on themselves than they needed to but other times they are feeling the way they are because of what they have done or have failed to do. It's difficult to watch someone who has their face buried in their hands sobbing uncontrollably. What is harder is when they look up and ask, "What kind of person would do that to her own family?" She knew the answer. That was why she was crying.

How does your guilt feel? Does it hit you like a wrecking ball when you are confronted with the horrifying truth of how evil you really are or how much damage and pain you've caused? Does it leave you hopeless or even horrified at the truth you have to face sooner or later? The truth that you're never going to be the person you know you should be. The truth that makes you a failure to a holy God and undeserving of anything good from him.

You should know something about all those people who were overwhelmed by their guilt, they all found relief. They found it in the only place it can be found—in the God who pledges, **'1, even I**, am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more."

You might think your sins and weaknesses define you. They don't. Not in God's eyes. You know how you highlight a phrase and then hit "delete" when you are editing a document? God does that with your sins. He not only doesn't see them anymore,

he doesn't even remember them. He doesn't recall the worst things you've done or your habitual failings. So your sins not only don't define you before God, they don't condemn you to his punishment either.

How is that possible? God loved you with a love so amazing that he charged his Son, Jesus, with your sins and punished him in your place. All of the ways you have sinned or ever will sin, have been paid for. They are not on your record or clinging to your identity anymore.

Believe it, and in Jesus live unburdened from your guilt and in the joyful freedom of forgiveness.

Maundy Thursday

We hope and pray that you will spend Holy week worshipping your merciful Savior starting with Maundy Thursday on March 29th. The Lord's Supper will be celebrated at this service which begins at 7:00 PM. The word MAUNDY comes from the Latin word Mandate which means command. The command was not to receive the Lord's Supper, as some think, since Jesus instituted it on this day. No, the command he gave was that we love one another. Jesus, of course, showed us the full extent of his love for us by going to the cross. At this service we also remember the blessed meal which he gave us whereby we receive his body and blood - in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.

Good Friday

At Christ we offer two different services on Good Friday, March 30th. The first service will start at 1:00 PM and will feature special choral music by our school children. The second service will be held at 7:00 PM. This will be a Tenebrae service of darkness which will stand as a moving reminder of the darkness of our sins and what they caused. The Lord's Supper will be offered at both of these divine worship services.

<u>Attendees:</u> Mr. John Festerling, Mike Prahl, Nicholas Noble, Pastor Schreiner, Justin Schultz, Darik Lyons. Pastor opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer. Craig Heil was voted in to continue as Chairman and Nick Noble as Secretary

<u>EC Update:</u> Miss Gross provided her monthly update to the board. Miss Gross is also working on an employee handbook for current and any future ECC employees.

Financial – Treasurer Reports: Darik reviewed financial activity for the month of December along with the current balances. We need to start looking into how we are going to spend funds from the state in the amount of \$2,776.78. These funds are excess

funds in the lunch balance. It is a mandatory spend down required by the state.

Old Business: Security System was discussed. Justin has talked to some staff and says it is time we get a committee started. There was discussion as to who we open this committee up to? It was requested that one of the law enforcement members be on the committee. Decided that 5-6 people would be good. Several ideas were tossed around about the security system. CCCS Report- Mike brought up that we need to be upfront with new workers with our expectations of them. We need to be more open minded to what teacher are saying or suggesting. It was noted that communication is improving. Call Meeting- Health insurance is a concern from the present candidate that was recently called as Principal. This could potentially be the reason the call is returned. The candidate if still contemplating the call and praying about it. A decision will be made by the end of the week. Justin expressed concerns with the principal/teacher husband/wife team. Thoughts of a principal oversee his wife just might pose a conflict of interest. This was also a concern that Nick has and expressed the same concerns.

Lunch Report: Currently, we are charging \$2.65. Per state guidelines, we need to increase lunches to \$2.86 however we can only increase lunches by \$.10 at a time. As a result, new lunch price will be \$2.75 effective February 1, 2018. Darik proposed the \$.10 increased and it was seconded by Justin. There was a recall of the butter the school received. As a result, we have to dispose of the 35 pounds of butter, but we were reimbursed for it.

Pastor/Teacher Reports: New family with two students starting at Samuel. One in Kindergarten and one in 2nd grade. This family moved here from TX.

From the Board:

Mike said there is an opportunity to play in a BB tournament on Feb. 17th in Hutchinson. He requested \$75 for the tournament entry fee. Justin questioned why we do not partake in special events that SMSU puts on that the public schools attend. Thought it was a good idea to look into this since we are so close to SMSU. Nick questioned what we are doing to build our enrollment numbers up. Suggested that we start looking into marketing ideas now and not wait.

Pastor closed the meeting with prayer.
