# Know the Truth "Your word is truth." - John 17:17

Human beings have never stopped desiring to search for the truth. And who can blame us?

As we swim our way through life, so often we find ourselves in deep water over our heads, water that has a muddy bottom which is sometimes slimy and threatens to trap our feet. What could feel better than to finally touch a smooth, solid, rock bottom where we can plant our feet and rest, keep our heads above water, catch our breath?

God's word is rock-solid truth. That's how Jesus described it. He was speaking to his heavenly Father in prayer when he said, "Your word is truth." Though such a simple statement, it is a profound reality. The Son of God, Jesus Christ, testifies that the word of God the heavenly Father is truth!

It's hard sometimes to hear the truth. It can cause us to hang our head in shame and even cringe with fear. Truth that God tells us is every bit as difficult to hear. <u>Old Business:</u> Tuition – in order to get an updated tuition schedule finalized for Pre-K and Kindergarten rounds ups a motion was made and approve through email. Email motion by Darik to increase tuition for grades Kindergarten thru 8th grade beginning with the 2017-2018 school year as presented in the below table. Email responses were in favor. EC Call – first call was returned. New call issued on 3/5 and acknowledged on 3/7. EC Marketing – radio ads and Facebook marketing currently in progress. We have had over 4,000 hits on Facebook so far. Costs to cover these items will come out of the Misc. Other account. The board discussed other potential marketing ideas such as handing out materials at the Sounds of Summer parade and electronic billboards. EC age for summer – upper age threshold is any child who has completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

<u>Lunch Report:</u> Currently obtaining bids for garbage disposal and associated plumbing.

<u>Pastor/Teacher Reports:</u> CLYF – at the February meeting the group completed a community service project tying blankets. The March meet will be held with area WELS youth groups. Seven members will be participating in the BWCA trip in June. Pioneers – pine car derby will be held March 10 at 7pm.

Mrs. Zander retirement – costs will be split between school and church and possibly PTF. Craig will check with PTF. The school will contribute up to \$300.
