

God's Encouraging Word ... when I feel hopeless

EC Update: Currently have 8 summer contracts and they are broken down as follows: 4-Full time, 2-4 days, 2 -1 day

Miss Gross predicts 10 current pre-k students to be at registration. Miss Gross will provide official summer numbers to the board next meeting. It was asked about advertising. Last year we had radio ads. Around \$700 for several spots.

Open House for the ECC will be combined with pre-k roundup as original date was cancelled due to weather.

<u>Minutes:</u> No minutes were shared since Secretary Noble was absent.

<u>Financial – Treasurer Reports:</u> Darik reviewed financial activity for the month along with the current balances. We discussed using concession dollars for soccer equipment as well as new basketballs. Lunch Report: Looking at potential new equipment/appliance to use up state funds. *Stove/range is anywhere from \$3,500- to \$3,700. Convections Oven is anywhere from \$2,800 to \$3,200 The Board agreed a convection oven was most in need and is most used, will pursue more official quotes for this.

Pastor/Teacher Reports: CLYF has currently 2 families, total of 3 youth for the National Youth Rally. They are currently looking for transportation since Redwood option fell through with going to the Rally. Samuel Records: Parents from former students had commented to Board Chair that Samuel School could do a better job at documenting progress of students that have special learning needs. This is helpful for when the student move into public schools and their advisors felt more information would be useful. Mr. Festerling had explained what is all done in this process and took this under advisement for future situations.

From the Board: It was brought up that a serious look at drainage in from of school to be considered to prevent ice build-up and sitting water. Perhaps spend some significant dollars on drain tile to the street? This will be brought up at next council meeting.
