Service Notes:

- The Sixth Sunday of Easter is called "Rogate", which comes from today's Gospel, and means "ask." Since the middle of the 5th century, the three days following today were known as Rogation Days. On these days, Christians offered prayers, especially for the growth of the fruits of the field in a new growing season.
- First Lesson: Instead of asking God to provide for their needs, the Israelites grumbled. Moses prayed for them, and God had a serpent "lifted up" (Jn 3:14) that they might not die.
- Second Lesson: Through the mediator Jesus Christ, mankind has the privilege of asking God—for anyone and anything.
- Gospel: Jesus instructs his disciples to ask the Father in His name.
- Our Father who in Heaven Above: Luther's catechism hymns were written, just like the Small Catechism itself, to help parents teach the Christian faith in their homes.

FIRST COMMUNION: Our 2021 confirmands will receive their first Holy Communion together as a class in the first table of communion today. "I certainly love it with all my heart, the precious, blessed Supper of my Lord Jesus Christ, in which He gives me His body and blood to eat and to drink orally, with the mouth of my body, accompanied by the exceedingly sweet and gracious words: Given for you, shed for you" (Martin Luther).

ASCENSION: The Festival of the Ascension of our Lord will be celebrated in a joint Divine Service at St. John's Lutheran in Wood Lake (130 3rd Street). The service begins at 7:00 PM on Thursday. An ice cream social will take place following the service.
