Verse of the Day

The congregation sings this alleluia <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> the proper verse is sung by the minister or soloist.



VERSE OF THE DAY: I saw the Holy City, the New Jerusalem prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.

- The Bridegroom Soon Will Call Us: Johann Walter was one of the first Lutheran musicians. In 1524 he was summoned to Wittenberg by Luther to prepare music for use in Lutheran church services. This 1552 hymn was originally composed in 33 or 34 stanzas. Notice the direct reference to today's Gospel.
- The preparatory and penitential season of Advent begins next Sunday. It is customary to omit the Gloria in Excelsis during Advent (and Lent). The next time we sing this song of the angels will be at the first Divine Service of Christmas.
- First Lesson: God's people long for the day when God makes all things new; they will be a people blessed by the Lord.
- Second Lesson: As the end approaches, walk in the light.
- Gospel: Keep watch! Keep awake! Fill your lamps! For you do not know the day or the hour.
- Wake, Awake: This hymn by Philipp Nicolai (1556–1608), is commonly referred to as "The King of Chorales." The hymn beautifully describes the Church's joy as she prepares to meet her heavenly bridegroom, Christ Jesus.
- Rejoice, Rejoice Believers: Lutheran hymnwriters often wrote collections of hymns based on the Gospels for the Sundays of the

Church Year. This hymn was written for the 27th Sunday after Trinity.

• The end of the church year flows almost seamlessly into the new year. The waiting and watching of the end times leads us to cry out, "Come, Jesus; come quickly!"
