## Verse of the Day

The congregation sings this alleluia before and after the proper verse is sung by the minister or soloist.



VERSE OF THE DAY: I will proclaim your name to my people; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.

### **SERVICE NOTES:**

- Absolution: The authority to forgive sins which Jesus demonstrates in today's Gospel is the authority which Christ gives his ministers who announce forgiveness in his name.
- First Lesson: The place where God makes promises to sinful men is called "the house of God."
- Second Lesson: God's true healing starts on the inside and works its way out. It begins by cleansing our hearts from sin and results in being made new in our attitudes and actions.
- Gospel: Jesus' healing of the paralytic begins with the cause (sin) and continues with the consequence.
- Lord, You I Love with All My Heart: Martin Schalling's 1567 hymn was originally called "for the Dying" and has also been called "a prayer to Christ, the consolation of the soul in life and death...and a treasure bequeathed to the church from the heart of Schalling."

- Jesus, Sinners Does Receive: In addition to hymns such as this. Erdmann Neumeister also wrote texts (librettos) for church cantatas. many of which were used later by J.S. Bach.
- I Lie, O Lord, Within Your Care: The text of this evening hymn reassures the Christian of God's comfort and protection during the coming night. Worries and sorrows will not trouble us because God's grace guides us through our sleep. It will still be there in the morning as we face the unknown of the coming day. Jochen Klepper, son of a Polish minister, penned the words of this hymn. In 1931 Klepper married Johanna Stone, a Jewish widow. This family knew the meaning of trouble because of the persecution they faced
