## *From the* **PASTOR**—

### **God's Encouraging Word ... *when I am tired***

Sleep experts advise getting seven to eight hours of sleep a night. We need rest for our tired bodies to recuperate.

Even on the most regular day, life is draining. The work day is long and the demands are great. Getting the kids to school, work schedules, meeting deadlines, grocery shopping, getting dinner ready, children's activities, only to get ready to do it over again the next day. Getting older doesn't help matters. By the time you hit the pillow at night you may feel like a smart device that has only 2% battery life left.

But what do you do when you become tired emotionally? It's the exhaustion that comes from strained relationships, heated arguments and being rejected by those from whom you want acceptance.

## PASTORAL ACTS

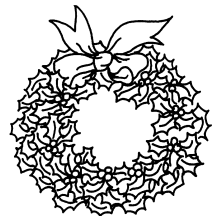

## COMMUNION INFORMATION

It has been a while since we have written anything regarding our procedure concerning logistical items about the Lord's Supper. Since we have a number of new members who might not be sure of some things here goes a brief explanations.

The rose colored cups in the center of the individual tray contain a few drops of wine that have been diluted with water. These are reserved for those who might be allergic to wine or who might be recovering from alcoholism. Remember, it is not the amount or alcohol content of the wine that is important but that we do it in accordance with and how Jesus instituted it. If you want to receive the common cup you need only let it touch your lips and taste the wine that way.

We now have gluten free wafers if that is something you need. We ask that you speak to pastor ahead of time so he can offer you this option but please, only if you physically need to be gluten free.

Just a reminder that when you are the first one in line you need to go all the way over to the pulpit or on the other side to the wall by the baptismal candles so that everyone can comfortably stand at the table. Also you might not have noticed but our current pastor is not the tallest man so if you can be sure to stand as close as possible to the first step that would be helpful. When receiving the host (bread) be sure to hold out your hand if you wish to have the wafer placed in it. For those taking the individual cup be sure it is visible when pastor passes in front of you so he can see you do not wish to receive the common cup. For those taking the common cup remember to gently grasp the bottom of the chalice and guide it to your lips. Thanks for your attention to these minor but important matters!

## **WHAT'S CHANGED ON THE CHARITABLE GIVING LANDSCAPE**

I'm sure all of you have heard the words of Jesus recorded in Matthew's gospel ***"Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's."*** The words are very straightforward and easy for us to understand. That does not make them easy to follow though. Christian stewardship is something that all of us need to evaluate in our lives in an ongoing basis. We are very blessed in our congregation to have someone who can help us understand, from a spiritual as well as governmental way, how we can put this into practice. The article below offers some insight as well as a chance to learn more about how we can give to the government and to our God in a pleasing way.

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) went into effect on January 1, 2018. Where it will take several years to figure out all the winners and losers, some of the obvious losers are our churches and other charitable groups. How much do people care about tax breaks related to their contributions? According to Charity Navigator, 12% of annual giving occurs in the last three days of the calendar year. The answer is clear.

Changes to the tax law in 2018 have taken away most people's ability to deduct charitable contributions. But there are still a few options to consider in order to give and still receive a certain amount of tax benefits. Examples include "bunching techniques", the use of donor advised funds, the use of IRA's for those at age 70.5, and the use of appreciated assets such as securities or real estate.

Gary St. Aubin and the Stewardship committee will present this information to our Congregation on October 14, 2018. The first presentation will be at 11:30 after the second service and the second presentation will be at 4:30. Both presentations will be held at the Church.

Where were we at the time? How did we feel when it was happening and after it was over? What would we have done if we had been on one of the planes? Our lives have changed because of the events of that day. We are thankful for the military and their families. This day brought many people back to God. We always need to be ready and realize that God is always watching over us and protecting us.

Pam thanked Pastor for leading us in this discussion and thanked Amy for playing the hymn.

We welcomed Kali Gross as a member of Mission Society.

The Secretary’s report from June was read and approved. The Treasurer’s report was read and approved.

Kathy reported that there was nothing to report for Altar/Communion Care.

Jenny told us the MLC Rally will be held Saturday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, at MLC.

Julie reported on the LWMS National Convention that was held in Green Bay: There were 1,450 attendees. Mission Projects Offering (our mite box offerings) totaled \$125,413.64. This money was divided between the Caribbean Scholarship Fund and Cameroon Mission. The Worship Service Offering totaled \$61,829.05 and was given to First Public Service Assistance and Academia Cristo. The kids c.a.r.e. offering (money collected by Lutheran Elementary Schools and Sunday Schools) totaled \$49,443.57 for this year and was given to Feeding Jesus’ Lambs in Nepal. The 2019 National Convention will be June 27-30, 2019 and will be held at the Iowa Events Center in Des Moines, Iowa. The theme will be “Let Us Ever Walk With Jesus in the Heartland”. The Fall Minnekota Rally will be held on Saturday, October 20<sup>th</sup> at St. Peter’s in Balaton. The speaker for the day will be Pastor Kruschel from Danube, He will speak on “Outreach in Rural Communities”. We will be taking our fall mite box collection on Sunday, October 7<sup>th</sup>.

Joyce reported on CAMM: There are 21 people serving at our clinic. They see 4,000-5,000 people per month. Right now they are having their dry season so there have been fewer cases of

malaria. Malawi is known as the “Warm Heart of Africa” because of the positive attitudes of the people.

Our next meeting will be Thursday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. We will be having elections at that meeting. We thanked Pam for serving. Deb Herrmann will serve in November.

Roll call was taken with 8 ladies and Pastor present. The meeting was adjourned and we closed with the Lord’s Prayer and Common Table Prayer.
