From the **PASTOR**—

As another school year is about to begin, allow me to share some selections from the Preface to Luther's Large Catechism. Christian Catechesis, which is learning and growing in the faith, is not something that takes place only when we are children. Catechesis is the lifelong endeavor of every Christian.

"But for myself I say this: I am also a doctor and preacher; yes, as learned and experienced as all the people who have such assumptions and contentment. Yet I act as a child who is being taught the catechism. Every morning—and whenever I have time—I read and say, word for word, the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, the Psalms, and such. I must still read and study them daily. Yet I cannot master the catechism as I wish. But I must remain a child and pupil of the catechism, and am glad to remain so."

"Besides, catechism study is a most effective help against the devil, the world, the flesh, and all evil thoughts. It helps to be occupied with God's Word, to speak it, and meditate on it, just as the first Psalm declares people blessed who meditate on God's Law day and night. Certainly you will not release a stronger incense or other repellant against the devil than to be engaged by God's commandments and words, and speak, sing, or think them. For this is indeed the true "holy water" and "holy sign" from which the devil runs and by which he may be driven away.

Now, for this reason alone you ought gladly to read, speak, think, and use these things, even if you had no other profit and fruit from them than driving away the devil and evil thoughts by doing so. For he cannot hear or endure God's Word."

"If these reasons were not enough to move us to read the catechism daily, we should feel bound well enough by God's command alone. He solemnly commands in Deuteronomy 6:6–8

that we should always meditate on His precepts, sitting, walking, standing, lying down, and rising. We should have them before our eyes and in our hands as a constant mark and sign. Clearly He did not solemnly require and command this without a purpose. For He knows our danger and need, as well as the constant and furious assaults and temptations of devils. He wants to warn, equip, and preserve us against them, as with a good armor against their fiery darts and with good medicine against their evil infection and temptation.

Oh, what mad, senseless fools are we! While we must ever live and dwell among such mighty enemies as the devils, we still despise our weapons and defense, and we are too lazy to look at or think of them!

What else are such proud, arrogant saints doing who are unwilling to read and study the catechism daily? They think they are much more learned than God Himself with all His saints, angels, prophets, apostles, and all Christians. God Himself is not ashamed to teach these things daily. He knows nothing better to teach. He always keeps teaching the same thing and does not take up anything new or different. All the saints know nothing better or different to learn and cannot finish learning this. Are we not the finest of all fellows to imagine that if we have once read or heard the catechism, we know it all and have no further need to read and learn? Can we finish learning in one hour what God Himself cannot finish teaching? He is engaged in teaching this from the beginning to the end of the world. All prophets, together with all saints, have been busy learning it, have ever remained students, and must continue to be students.”

MIDWEEK BIBLE STUDY

This fall I would like to offer an opportunity for adult Bible study, an opportunity for this ongoing catechesis. It seems best to hold a weekly study on the same evening when I come to Marshall for our public school catechism class. That will probably be **Thursday evening**, but the time has not yet been set. Watch the church bulletin for details.

I would like to start by looking at the Augsburg Confession, the first and chief confession of the Lutheran Church. We'll learn some of our history along the way, but this study will draw us into the Scriptures as we cover the most basic tenets of the Christian faith.

SOUND/VIDEO SYSTEM UPGRADES

Given the events of this past 1-1/2 years or so, we have seen the importance of our ability to stream/broadcast our services. In an effort to improve the quality and reliability of this technology, the voters at Christ Lutheran recently approved funds to upgrade the audio and video equipment. You may have already noticed the congregational microphones hanging from the ceiling in church (hopefully not, the goal was to make them blend in as much as possible, but I guess you will now!). These will allow the viewers/listeners to better hear the singing and organ playing. In the balcony, we already have installed new sound equipment that will greatly improve the sound quality. The final phase of this upgrade (to be installed in the next few weeks) will include 2 new video cameras, which will allow for full coverage of the front of the church. All of this will not only greatly improve sound and video quality, but also establish a more reliable system as well as make it easier for an individual to run all of the equipment on their own. Please be patient as we work to finalize the remaining equipment, as while we will do everything within our power to avoid any disruptions, technology can sometimes get the better of us!

HYMN FESTIVAL

On Sunday afternoon, October 3 (4:00pm), we will be holding a hymn festival at Christ Lutheran. This special service will feature our new church organ (since its dedication took place while various restrictions were in place). It will also include a few hymns from the new Christian Worship hymnal which will be released this fall. We'll have organ, instruments, choir, and congregational singing. Come join us as we lift our voices in song and celebrate our heritage of hymnody in the Lutheran church.
