

Mid-Term Reports: Mid-term grade reports were sent home on Monday. Please contact your child's teacher if you did not receive it.

Singing on Sunday: Preschool through grade two will sing in the 8:00 service this Sunday, October 14th. The students will sing at the front of church and then sit with their families when they are finished. We will meet in the church basement at 7:45.

Vision/Hearing Screening: Mrs. Flock will conduct vision and hearing screenings on Thursday. Be sure your student wears their glasses that day.

MAP Testing: We will begin our standardized testing next week. We will again be using MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) Testing which is done on the computers. We started using this last school year. Just a reminder that with these tests the questions will gradually get harder or easier depending on if students answer correctly or incorrectly to try and give a better indication of where each student is at academically. Each classroom will be staggering when they take the tests so that computers can be in each classroom for when they need to take the tests. Our testing window will be from Monday, October 15 through Friday, November 2. Our hope is that this will allow enough time to generate results that can be shared with you at parent teacher conferences on November 8 or November 9.

Fire Prevention Week: This is fire prevention week. The theme is "LOOK. LISTEN. LEARN. Be aware. Fire can happen anywhere." The Marshall Fire Department will be visiting our school today for fire drills as a part of Operation E.D.I.T.H. On Thursday, the third grade students will have an opportunity to experience a smoke filled building in a safe environment when they visit a portable smoke house. Everyone is invited to an open house and burger meal at the fire department Thursday evening from 5:30 – 8:00.

Early Out: On Wednesday, October 17th school will dismiss at 12:00. The busses will transport and the students will eat lunch before they leave.

No School: There will be no school on Thursday and Friday, October 18-19 as our teachers will be attending the Minnesota District Teacher's Conference at St. Croix Lutheran Academy in West St. Paul.

Field Trip: On Friday, November 2 that 3-8 graders will be taking a field trip to the Lyon County Regional Landfill. We do not need any drivers as they provide busing for us. The bus will be picking us up at school that Friday at 8:15 a.m. We will receive a short presentation at the landfill about how the landfill is built, how it works, recycling, and a short hands-on activity. We will then get a tour of the landfill itself on the bus. It will be making three stops within the landfill where we can get off the bus and see firsthand what goes on at the landfill so please make sure your student is dressed appropriately for weather that day. The presentation and tour will last an hour at which time we will come back to school for the remainder of the day. We do have some spots open yet so if any parent wants to come with us on the landfill tour please let Mr. Obry or Mrs. MacArthur know.
