**School Closings:** Just a reminder that as we get closer to days that may offer more inclement weather, that we will again be letting you know via our school's text messaging system. The radio stations ask us to let parents know to please not call the radio station to ask if school is closed or late in order to keep the lines open for the school officials to call. **From the Nurse's Office Regarding Dispensing Medicine at School:** Our school nurse, Mrs. Flock, recommends that parents give Tylenol, cough syrups, cough drops, vitamins, or any other over-the-counter (OTC) medications at home before school, after school, and at bedtime if necessary so the school does not need to become involved. The teachers are not supposed to administer any of these items without doctor's permission. The nurse also suggests mints or lemon drops work as well as the medicated cough drops. Since these are not medicine, teachers could supervise use of these items. If specific circumstances occur where your child needs to take prescribed medicine at times away from home, you would have to contact the school nurse. Mrs. Flock is not in the school every day. She comes in once a week to do paper work and give advice if we have any health questions. Thank you for your cooperation.
